

Rocky in June ~ Have you signed up yet? Have your motel reservations? The time is NOW!

With less than two months before RMOWP's annual conference, it's time to make the commitment and send in your registration form and check.

The 35th annual conference takes place Sunday through Thursday, June 8-12, in Estes Park, Colorado, at the eastern entrance to Rocky Mountain National Park, and will offer a variety of workshops and field trips, including four trips into the national park. These include a photo workshop

with renowned wildlife photographer Weldon Lee (see the accompanying article), plus a guided walk with a park naturalist, the always-popular sunrise photo shoot, and a tour into the high country on Trail Ridge Road.

We'll also take a trip into Hermit Park, a striking natural area that is just now being opened to the public after 40 years under private ownership. Now a county park, its 42,000 acres include high meadow grasslands, forested slopes, wetlands, and rounded granite rock formations. And who says there's no such thing as a free lunch? The Estes Park Convention and Visitors Bureau is bringing a barbecue lunch to the park for our group, as well as providing transportation.

Other activities include writing and photo critique sessions, a talk on the history of Rocky Mountain National Park with local author and historian Curt Buchholz, and a trip to the MacGregor Ranch Museum, a working cattle ranch that dates to 1873.


Workshops include programs on keeping digital camera images spot-free, how to get that winning photograph, and tips on getting the most from Adobe Photoshop's sharpening and selection tools.

Conference headquarters is Estes Rodeway Inn, 1701 N. Lake Ave., and the special rate for conference attendees, available through May 9, is \$88 per night (one or two people) for premium rooms, which offer either one king bed or two queens, refrigerators, and microwaves. Rates include a continental breakfast and pets are accepted with a fee and prior notification. For reservations, call the Rodeway Inn directly at 800-458-1182 or 970-586-5363, and be sure to tell them you are attending the RMOWP conference.

Camping in Estes Park

For those who want to camp, there are more than a half dozen commercial campgrounds in Estes Park, including the Estes Park KOA (800-562-1887; www.EstesParkKOA. com), which is within sight of the conference headquarters Rodeway Inn. There are also campgrounds in Rocky Mountain National Park, and the least expensive camping is in the adjacent Roosevelt National Forest.

Conference Instructor No Stranger to the Limelight

Among the many activities planned at this year's RMOWP conference are a sit-down workshop followed by a photo field trip with Weldon Lee, described by a University of Northern Iowa photography instructor as "One of the top five wildlife photographers in America." His photos and articles appear in each issue of Nature Photographer magazine, of which he is assistant editor, and you've also seen his work in Peterson's PHOTOgraphic, Bird Watcher's Digest, Backpacker, National Parks Magazine, and numerous other publications. Lee has also written two books. Watchable Birds of the Rocky Mountains and A Guide to Photographing Rocky Mountain Wildlife.

His company, Rocky Mountain Photo Adventures, has been leading wildlife photo safaris for 20 years, to destinations around the world including South Africa, Galapagos, Ecuador, Alaska, and Canada, as well as Colorado, New Mexico, and other areas in the lower 48.

A member of Rocky Mountain Outdoor Writers and Photographers, in 2007 he was awarded the organization's Selected Works Award for Excellence in Photography.

"Wildlife photography is more than capturing an image," Lee says, "It is the opportunity to preserve on film the drama of a fleeting moment in the life of one of my wild brothers and sisters. When I am fortunate enough to capture one of those moments,

I begin to realize that I'm touching something greater than life itself."





Since 1991, Robert has been writer, photographer, and publisher of Day Hike Books, and he tells us that he has hiked every trail in the *Day Hike* series, which now includes 23 titles, many in their third and fourth editions.

The thoroughly revised and expanded third edition of *Day Hikes Around Missoula, Montana* includes 83 hikes within a 70-mile radius of the city. While many hikes are located within the city itself, most are found in the surrounding valleys, mountains, and national forests, and

include easy nature walks as well as high-elevation treks to overlooks with expansive vistas.

This first edition of *Day Hikes Around Napa Valley* provides details on 88 hikes throughout the valley, across nearby mountain ranges, along bays and rivers, and through cool forests. Highlights include secluded redwood forests, the largest freshwater lake in California, a massive petrified forest, and expansive ridge-top vistas to the Pacific and San Francisco. Also included is comprehensive trail access information for dog owners.
